RFGSA Overview

- "Independent" Not For Profit 501c(6)
 - Members: Refiners, Producers, importers,
 blenders, fuel suppliers
- Design/Implement alternative Industry fuel compliance programs - meet or exceed regulations requirements
- Industry Flexibility/Efficient compliance
- EPA Effective compliance better information on conformance



RFGSA Overview

RFGSA Background

- Clean Air Act (CAA) 1990 Reformulated Gasoline/Anti-dumping
 - Opportunity for "Industry" RFG compliance
- American Petroleum Institute (API)/National Petroleum Refiners Association (NPRA)
 - Studies
 - Feasibility/Organizational Options/Costs
 - Members voted create independent organization
 - Start-up funding

- Formed in August 1994

 - No lobbying*
 - 38 Founding Members Refiners, Importers, blenders
 - F.C. Lenski Elected President
 - Operations commenced 01/95




RFG Survey Association - Mission

 - RFG Services Inc. Inactive





Compliance Overview

- Objective driven
- Necessary fiduciary responsibly measured
 - Identify/promptly correct
 - Create Incentives for proper compliance/penalize
- Measured monitored
- Multi-faceted
- Costly Companies/Government
- Ineffective/Inefficient



Compliance Liability

- Refiners/Producers/Importers/Blenders are primarily responsible for fuel compliance
 - Track back to supplier/producer
- Concept "Presumptive liability"
 - assumes everyone is the distribution system is liable - until proven otherwise
 - requirements along the system
- Resources to ensure compliance



Federal – Compliance Regulations

- 40 CFR Part 80
- RFG Compliance on "average" vs. "per gallon" one or more requirements §80.41
 - Compliance Surveys §80.67, §80.68
- Ethanol Downstream oxygenate blending Quality assurance testing §80.69(a)(6)& (7)
- ULSD Sampling and Testing Defense Elements
 - Branded Refiner, distributor and fuel supplier
 - §80.613



Federal Compliance Regulations

- E15 Fuel Partial Wavier approved for 2001+vehicles - Mitigate Mis-fueling – Gasoline >10 ethanol volume percent - §80.1501-08
- Ethanol Flex Fuel REG Rule 10/2016 scheduled implementation 01/2018 §80.1561-2
 - Ethanol Bulk Blenders, Blenders, Site Blenders
 - Leverage existing E15 survey
 - Fuels Survey Consolidation concept



AZ Regulations - Compliance

- R20-2-751 Average standards
- R20-2-755 Downstream oxygenate blending -Nov-March 31
- R20-2-760 Compliance Surveys June-Sept.
 15



Survey Participation - Benefits

Program Development - Overview

- Examination of Regulations
 - Opportunities for more effective & efficient compliance
- Develop concept/plans
 - Present Options Association/Industry/EPA buyin
 - Work Industry Associations make formal requests - interim approvals (Enforcement tools)
- Program Administration/Implementation
- Regulation compliance optimization options



RFGSA Operations Survey Design

- Survey Design Plans
 - Annually Performance Based Conservative
 - End user based
- Methodology Statistical Design
 - "Representative" all gasoline
 - Market Share equivalent"
 - Sample selection Random
 - Probability Proportional to Size (PPS)
 - Weighted based on volume



Field Operations - Database

- Sources
 - Census/Program data/Fleet/CC sources/Members/Internet
- Structure Strata/Clusters/by Program
 - Densely Populated Areas (DPA), Trans. routes, Rural
 - Clusters Population, size, SS counts
 - Weighted (i.e. volumes)
- Dynamic Updated ongoing, full updates (2-3 yrs.) 2016



Field Operations

- Retail Sampling End User
- Independent Contractors (IC's)
 - No "member" affiliation
- Web-based training Programs
 - "Certified" every two years or not selected
- Problems in field "Exceptions"
 - Performance audited & tracked



Lab Operations - Testing

- Independent Lab Operations
- Confidentiality agreements
- Tier III compliant
- ISO certified 9001 /17025 certified
- Designated Test methods
- EPA & QA Lab Correlation
- Automated
- Industry Resource




Reporting/Compliance System

- Reporting/Compliance done via website
 - Detail reports direct retail
 - Aggregate Industry tracking
 - Non-Compliance (PNC)
 - Expedited schedule
- Compliance system document and respond Potential non-compliance (PNC's)

- Field/Lab Operations
 - Independent auditors
 - EPA & QA Lab Correlation
 - Industry Correlations
 - Exceptions Tracking
- Training Issues
- Technical Committee Meetings
- RFGSA Financial Audit



Funding/Dues

- Program participating companies
- Minimum program dues
- Dues basis volume/per site fee/other
- Estimated expenses
- Annual Reconcilation "verified" actual expenses - estimates (pgm)
- Annual Financial Audit RFGSA
